

SPEECH SUMMER HOMEWORK SUGGESTIONS

Below you will find speech summer homework suggestions. Be creative in completing the homework – if you are unable to work on it each day, feel free to do several days' work at one time. The important thing is to practice during the summer vacation. It is very evident in September who has completed their summer homework and who has not – it makes that much difference in their speech/language skills!

The areas are divided into language and articulation skills. If your child is working on particular speech sounds, please refer to those sounds on your copy of your child's IEP or progress note.
